Our innovators have developed emergency mobile public kitchens, inclusive integrated shelter management system, and a healthcare access mobile application specifically for people living with HIV/AIDS.



The Community-Led Innovation Partnership (CLIP) supports locally developed solutions for humanitarian challenges in Guatemala, Indonesia, and the Philippines. In Indonesia, YAKKUM Emergency Unit (YEU) implements IDEAKSI, a CLIP project focused on innovative and inclusive disaster response solutions for at-risk groups, including people with disabilities and older people. This initiative is supported by Elrha, Start Network, ADRRN Tokyo Innovation Hub, and funded by the UK Foreign, Commonwealth, and Development Office (FCDO).
